






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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Assessment

Paterson Group was retained by Rosefellow developments to conduct a Phase I-Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for the property addressed 405 Huntmar Drive, in the City of Ottawa, Ontario. The purpose of this Phase I-ESA was to research the past and current use of the subject site and the Phase I Study Area and to identify any environmental concerns with the potential to have impacted the Phase I ESA Property.

According to the historical research, the Phase I Property was first developed as a farmstead prior to 1947. The Phase I Property remained a farmstead with the exception of the construction of a residential structure at the southeast corner of the Phase I Property in the 1970's. The farmstead and residential structure on the Phase I Property were subsequently demolished in the 2010's. An ERIS database report was obtained as part of the historical assessment. No on-site or off-site PCAs were identified in the ERIS database search. The historical use of the surrounding lands consisted of primarily agricultural land use, while some commercial and residential structures have been constructed in the last 10 years. Based on the historical research of the Phase I Property, no on-site or off-site PCAs were identified.

Following the historical research, a site visit was conducted. The Phase I ESA Property currently exists as a vacant agricultural farmland with a gravel laneway accessible from Huntmar Drive. Some remaining concrete debris from the former farmstead was present on the Phase I Property in addition to stockpiles of topsoil from the neighbouring developments. No PCAs were identified on the Phase I ESA Property during the site visit.

Neighbouring land use in the Phase I Study Area consists of agricultural, commercial and residential land use. No existing off-site PCAs were identified within the Phase I Study Area.

Based on the findings of our assessment, it is **our opinion that a Phase II-Environmental Site Assessment is not required for the subject property.**



1.0 INTRODUCTION

At the request of Rosefellow Developments, Paterson Group (Paterson) conducted a Phase I-Environmental Site Assessment (Phase I-ESA) for the property addressed 405 Huntmar Road, in the City of Ottawa, Ontario, herein referred to as the Phase I Property. The purpose of this Phase I-ESA was to research the past and current use of the Phase I ESA Property and properties within the Phase I Study Area to identify any potentially contaminating activities (PCAs) that would result in areas of potential environmental concern (APECs) on the Phase I Property.

Paterson was engaged to conduct this Phase I-ESA by Mr. Nathanael Niedermann with Rosefellow Developments. The head office is located at 750 Marcel-Laurin, Suite 210, Saint-Laurent, Quebec. Mr. Niedermann can be reached by telephone at (514) 532-1080.

This report has been prepared specifically and solely for the above noted project which is described herein. It contains all of our findings and results of the environmental conditions at this site.

This Phase I-ESA report has been prepared under the supervision of a Qualified Person, in general accordance with Ontario Regulation (O.Reg.) 153/04, as amended under the Environmental Protection Act. The conclusions presented herein are based on information gathered from a limited historical review and field inspection program. The findings of the Phase I-ESA are based on a review of readily available geological, historical and regulatory information and a cursory review made at the time of the field assessment. The historical research relies on information supplied by others, such as, local, provincial and federal agencies and was limited within the scope-of-work, time and budget of the project herein.

3.0 SCOPE OF INVESTIGATION

The scope of work for this Phase I – Environmental Site Assessment was as follows:				
	Determine the historical activities on the subject site and study area by conducting a review of readily available records, reports, photographs, plans, mapping, databases, and regulatory agencies;			
	Investigate the existing conditions present at the Phase I ESA Property and study area by conducting site reconnaissance;			
	Conduct interviews with persons knowledgeable of current and historic operations on the Phase I ESA Property, and if warranted, neighbouring properties;			
	Present the results of our findings in a comprehensive report in general accordance with the requirements O.Reg. 153/04 as amended under the Environmental Protection Act and in compliance with the requirements of CSA Z768-01;			
	Provide a preliminary environmental site evaluation based on our findings;			
	Provide preliminary remediation recommendations and further investigative work if contamination is suspected or encountered.

4.0 RECORDS REVIEW

4.1 General

Phase I-ESA Study Area Determination

A radius of approximately 250 m was determined to be appropriate as a Phase I Study Area for this assignment. Properties outside the 250 m radius are not considered to have impacted the Phase I ESA Property based on their significant separation distance.

First Developed Use Determination

Based on a review of the available aerial photographs, the Phase I Property was developed with a farmstead prior to 1947. For the purpose of this assessment, the Phase I ESA Property has never been formally developed but has been used for agricultural purposes with a farmstead prior to 1947.

Fire Insurance Plans

Fire insurance plans (FIPs) are not available for the area of the Phase I Property.

City of Ottawa Street Directories

City directories are not available for the area of the Phase I Property.

Chain of Title

Based on a review of previous engineering reports detailed below, a chain of title for the Phase I Property was completed in 2013. The Phase I Property was registered to West Ottawa Land Holdings (2) Inc. A review of the 2013 Chain of Title did not identify any PCAs. Based on the date of the previous chain of title, an updated search was not completed as the registered property owner has not changed.

Previous Environmental Reports

The following report was reviewed as part of this assessment:

"Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Vacant and Agricultural Property, 405-425 Huntmar Drive and 3001 Palladium Drive, Ottawa, Ontario," prepared by Paterson Group, dated January 8, 2014.



The Phase I ESA determined that the subject site was predominantly used for agriculture with vacant and forested portions of the land. At the time of the site inspection, temporary construction offices were located on the subject site in preparation of the development of the neighbouring lands. Based on the historical research and on-site observations, the Phase I ESA did not identify any potential environmental concerns on the Phase I ESA Property or the neighbouring properties. A Phase II ESA was not recommended.

Plan of Survey

A draft survey plan was reviewed in conjunction with an older survey plan prepared by Stantec, dated 2013, as part of this assessment.

The Phase I ESA Property is depicted in the plan in its current configuration. A copy of the draft survey plan and the 2013 survey plan are provided in Appendix 1.

4.2 Environmental Source Information

Environment Canada

A search of the National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) was conducted electronically on August 25, 2022. No records were found in the NPRI database for properties within the Phase I Study Area.

PCB Inventory

A search of the provincial PCB waste storage sites was conducted. No PCB waste storage sites were reported within the Phase I Study Area.

Areas of Natural Significance

A search for areas of natural significance and features within the Phase I Study Area was conducted on the website of the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) on August 25, 2022. The search did not reveal any areas of natural significance within the Phase I Study Area.

Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) Submissions

A request was submitted to the MECP Freedom of Information (FOI) office for information with respect to reports related to environmental conditions for the Phase I Property. A response from the MECP had not been received at the time this report was issued. The client will be contacted should any pertinent information be identified.

MECP Instruments

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to certificates of approval, permits to take water, certificates of property use or any other similar MECP issued instruments. A response from the MECP had not been received at the time this report was issued. The client will be contacted should any pertinent information be identified.

MECP Waste Management Records

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to waste management records as a part of this assessment. A response from the MECP had not been received at the time this report was issued. The client will be contacted should any pertinent information be identified.

MECP Incident Reports

A request was submitted to the MECP FOI office for information with respect to records concerning environmental incidents, orders, offences, spills, discharges of contaminants or inspections maintained by the MECP as a part of this assessment. A response from the MECP had not been received at the time this report was issued. The client will be contacted should any pertinent information be identified.

MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry (ESR)

A search of the MECP Brownfields Environmental Site Registry was conducted for the Phase I ESA Property and neighbouring properties within the Phase I Study area. No Records of Site Condition (RSCs) were filed within the Phase I Study area

MECP Waste Disposal Site Inventory

The Ontario Ministry of Environment document titled "Waste Disposal Site Inventory in Ontario, 1991" was reviewed as part of the historical research. This document includes all recorded waste disposal sites, industrial manufactured gas plants and coal tar distillation plants in the Province of Ontario. There are no former or active waste disposal sites located within 250 m of the Phase I ESA Property.

MECP Coal Gasification Plant Inventory

The Ontario Ministry of Environment document titled "Municipal Coal Gasification Plant Site Inventory, 1991" was reviewed to reference the locations of former plants with respect to the site. No Municipal Coal Gasification Plant Sites are located within the Phase I Study Area.

Environmental Risk Information Services (ERIS) Database Report

An ERIS (Environmental Risk Information Service) Database Report for the Phase I ESA Property and the neighbouring lands, dated August 23, 2022 was acquired and reviewed as part of this assessment. The complete ERIS report has been included in Appendix 2.

The ERIS search identified six on-site records, which include two certificates of approval, a waste generator summary record, two well water information system records and one borehole record. Eight off-site records were identified that include a waste generator summary, certificate of approvals, permits to take water, and one spill record associated with equipment failure of a hydraulicly operated motor vehicle.

Based on a review of the ERIS Report, the identified records are not considered to represent PCAs, and therefore, do not represent an environmental concern to the Phase I Property. A copy of the ERIS report is included in Appendix 2.

Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA)

The TSSA, Fuels Safety Branch in Toronto, was contacted on August 25, 2022, to inquire about current and former underground storage tanks, spills and incidents for the site and neighbouring properties. No TSSA related records were identified on the Phase I ESA Property or within the Phase I Study Area.



City of Ottawa Landfill Document

The document entitled "Old Landfill Management Strategy, Phase I – Identification of Sites, City of Ottawa", was reviewed. No former landfill sites were identified in within the Phase I Study Area.

City of Ottawa Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI)

A search request for the City of Ottawa's Historical Land Use Inventory (HLUI 2005) database was requested as part of this assessment A response from the City of Ottawa had not been received at the time this report was issued. The client will be contacted should any pertinent information be identified.

4.3 Physical Setting Sources

Aerial Photographs

Historical air photos from the National Air Photo Library were reviewed in approximate ten (10) year intervals. Based on the review, the following observations have been made:

1947	The Phase I Property appears to be occupied by a farm stead with agricultural fields and a single out building. Neighbouring properties appear to be occupied by agricultural lands.
1959	The Phase I Property appears to remain unchanged from the previous photograph. Adjacent and neighbouring properties also appear to remain largely unchanged.
1976	The Phase I Property appears largely unchanged with the exception of a small cleared section of the agricultural field that appears to be used for a small barn/storage structure. A residential structure has also been constructed on the southeast corner of the property.
1988	The Phase I Property remains unchanged from the previous photograph. Highway 417 has been constructed to the south.

been constructed on the opposite side of the highway.

No significant changes appear to have been made to the Phase I ESA Property. Campeau Drive and the 417 off ramp have been constructed to the south. Additionally, the Canadian Tire Centre has

All structures on the Phase I Property have been demolished and the property is now vacant. The commercial mall to the south has been constructed along with commercial buildings to the southwest of the Phase I Property. A residential subdivision has been constructed to the east and northeast.

Copies of selected aerial photographs reviewed are included in Appendix 1.

Physiographic Maps

The Ontario Geological Survey publication 'The Physiography of Southern Ontario, Third Edition' was reviewed as a part of this assessment. According to the publication, the Phase I ESA Property is situated within the Ottawa Clay Plain physiographic region.

Topographic Maps

Topographic maps were obtained from Natural Resources Canada – The Atlas of Canada website and from the City of Ottawa website.

The topographic maps indicate that the regional topography in the general area of the Phase I ESA Property slopes down in a southeasterly direction towards the Carp River. An illustration of the referenced topographic map is presented on Figure 2 – Topographic Map, appended to this report.

Geological Maps

The Geological Survey of Canada website on the Urban Geology of the National Capital Area was consulted as part of this assessment. Based on this information, bedrock in the area of the Phase I ESA Property is reported to consist of limestone and shale of the Verulam Formation, while the surficial geology reportedly consists of marine deposits of silt and clay with a drift thickness ranging from 15 to 25 m.

Water Well Records

A well record search was conducted on August 23, 2022 for all drilled wells within 250 m of the Phase I ESA Property. One well record was identified on the Phase I ESA Property associated with a potable well for domestic use. The search



returned four additional off-site well records associated with potable wells for domestic use, one well abandonment record, and one well record completed in 2020.

Based on the review of the identified well records, no identified records are considered to represent PCAs. The stratigraphy in the immediate area of the Phase I ESA Property consisted of clay and limestone bedrock. No other information was provided in the well records. A copy of the well records has been included in Appendix 2.

Areas of Natural Significance

No areas of natural significance were identified in the Phase I Study Area.

Water Bodies

No natural water bodies were identified in the Phase I Study Area. The nearest body of water is the Carp River located approximately 1 kilometer to the northeast.

5.0 SITE RECONNAISSANCE

5.1 General Requirements

The site visit was conducted on August 22, 2022 by Mr. Matthew Findley with Paterson Group. In addition to the site, the uses of neighbouring properties within the Phase I Study Area were also assessed at the time of the site visit, from publicly accessible areas.

5.2 Specific Observations at the Phase I Property

Buildings and Structures

There are no buildings or structures present on the Phase I ESA Property.

Site Features

The Phase I ESA Property is currently vacant with a gravel laneway accessible from Huntmar Drive. The Site topography is generally flat and at the grade of the adjacent properties and streets, while the regional topography slopes gently down in a south-eastly direction. Site drainage consists primarily of infiltration throughout the landscaped and gravel areas.



Three stockpiles of topsoil were present on the site along the western portion of the site. No signs of contamination or deleterious fill material was identified in the stockpiles. These stockpiles are likely associated with the development of the adjacent lands to the west. A stockpile of concrete associated with the foundation of the former farmstead was observed.

No evidence of current or former railway or spur lines was observed on the Phase I ESA Property at the time of the site visit. No areas of surficial staining or unidentified substances were observed on-site at this time.

Subsurface Services and Utilities

The Phase I ESA Property was historically serviced by a private well and septic system. No underground utilities and/or structures were identified on the Phase I ESA Property at the time of the site visit.

Neighbouring Properties

An inspection of the neighbouring properties was conducted from publicly accessible roadways at the time of the site inspection. Land use adjacent to the subject site is as follows:

North:	Residential, followed by agricultural land;
South:	Campeau Drive, followed by commercial mall;
East:	Huntmar Road, followed by residential; and
West:	Journeyman Street, followed by commercial office

Land use within the Phase I Study Area (250 m radius) consists of residential, agricultural and commercial purposes. No on-site or off-site PCAs were identified at the time of the site visit. Surrounding land use is shown on Drawing PE5836-2 – Surrounding Land Use Plan.

6.0 REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF INFORMATION

6.1 Land Use History

The Phase I Property is currently vacant and was historically used for agricultural purposes from prior to 1947 to circa 2021. The Phase I Property has been vacant and unused since approximately 2021.



Potentially Contaminating Activities and Areas of Potential Environmental Concern

Based on the findings of the Phase I ESA, no PCAs were identified on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I study area. As a result, there are no areas of potential environmental concern (APECs) with the Phase I Property.

Contaminants of Potential Concern

No Contaminants of Potential Concern (CPCs) were identified, since no APEC's were identified on the Phase I Property.

6.2 Conceptual Site Model

Geological and Hydrogeological Setting

According to the Geological Survey of Canada website, the bedrock in the area of the Phase I ESA Property is reported to consist of limestone and shale of the Verulam Formation. The overburden is reported to consist of off-shore marine deposits of silt and clay with depths ranging from 15 to 25 m over the entire site.

Fill Placement

Fill material may be present in two areas as a result from the demolition of the former farmstead on the central portion of the site and the former residential structure on the southeastern corner of the Phase I ESA Property. Three stockpiles of topsoil were present on the site along the western portion of the site. No signs of contamination or deleterious fill material was identified in the stockpiles of topsoil.

Areas of Natural Significance

No areas of natural significance were identified in the Phase I Study Area.

Water Bodies

The nearest body of water is the Carp River located approximately 1 kilometer to the northeast.

Drinking Water Wells

No potable water wells on the Phase I ESA Property, however, potable wells are still present within the Phase I study area to the north.



Existing Buildings and Structures

There are no buildings or structures present on the Phase I ESA Property.

Subsurface Structures and Utilities

The Phase I ESA Property was historically serviced by a private well and septic system. No underground utilities and/or structures were identified on the Phase I ESA Property.

Neighbouring Land Use

Land use within the Phase I Study Area (250 m radius) consists of residential, agricultural and commercial purposes.

Potentially Contaminating Activities and Areas of Potential Environmental Concern

As per Section 6.1 of this report, no PCAs were identified on the Phase I Property or within the Phase I study area. As a result, there are no areas of potential environmental concern (APECs) with the Phase I Property.

Contaminants of Potential Concern

No Contaminants of Potential Concern (CPCs) were identified, since no APEC's were identified on the Phase I Property.

Assessment of Uncertainty and/or Absence of Information

The information available for review as part of the preparation of this Phase I- ESA is considered to be sufficient to conclude that there are no on- and off-site PCA that have resulted in APECs on the Phase I ESA Property.

A variety of independent sources were consulted as part of this assessment, and as such, the conclusions of this report are not affected by uncertainty which may be present with respect to the individual sources.




FIGURE 1 KEY PLAN






FIGURE 2 TOPOGRAPHIC MAP

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

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



The Record of Site Condition (RSC) is part of the Ministry of the Environment's Brownfields Environmental Site Registry. Protection from environmental cleanup orders for property owners is contingent upon documentation known as a record of site condition (RSC) being filed in the Environmental Site Registry. In order to file an RSC, the property must have been properly assessed and shown to meet the soil, sediment and groundwater standards appropriate for the use (such as residential) proposed to take place on the property. The Record of Site Condition Regulation (O. Reg. 153/04) details requirements related to site assessment and clean up.

RSCs filed after July 1, 2011 will also be included as part of the new (O.Reg. 511/09).

'Site Report Summary'-Project Property'- This section lists all the records which fall on the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

'Site Report Summary-Surrounding Properties'- This section summarizes all records on adjacent properties, listing them in order of proximity from the project property. For more details, see the 'Detail Report' section.

<u>Map Key:</u> The map key number is assigned according to closest proximity from the project property. Map Key numbers always start at #1. The project property will always have a map key of '1' if records are available. If there is a number in brackets beside the main number, this will indicate the number of records on that specific property. If there is no number in brackets, there is only one record for that property.

The symbol and colour used indicates 'elevation': the red inverted triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Lower Elevation', the yellow triangle will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Higher Elevation' and the orange square will dictate 'ERIS Sites with Same Elevation.'

<u>Unplottables:</u> These are records that could not be mapped due to various reasons, including limited geographic information. These records may or may not be in your study area, and are included as reference.
