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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This feasibility report describes a transportation noise and vibration assessment undertaken in support of a Zoning By-Law Amendment (ZBA) for a proposed mixed-use development located at 2070 Scott Street in Ottawa, Ontario. The development is a 23-storey building with a slender rectangular tower mounted on a 5-storey podium. The ground floor will contain commercial retail units, on the west side, townhouses to the east, and a residential lobby in the centre. The remaining floors will have residential dwellings. Outdoor amenity areas in the form of shared and private terraces are located on the 6th floor along the south side of the development. The primary sources of transportation noise are Scott Street, Churchill Avenue North and the Light Rail Transit (LRT) corridor operated by the OC Transpo. In addition, this report also provides an analysis of ground borne vibration impacts from the LRT. Figure 1 illustrates a complete site plan with surrounding context.

The assessment is based on (i) theoretical noise prediction methods that conform to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) and City of Ottawa requirements; (ii) noise level criteria as specified by the City of Ottawa's Environmental Noise Control Guidelines (ENCG); (iii) future vehicular traffic volumes based on the City of Ottawa's Official Plan roadway classifications; (iv) ground borne vibration criteria as specified by the Federal Transit Authority (FTA) Protocol; and (v) site plan drawings prepared by Quadrangle Architects Limited in August 2019.

The results of the current analysis indicate that noise levels will range between 56 and 70 dBA during the daytime period (07:00-23:00) and between 58 and 62 dBA during the nighttime period (23:00-07:00). The highest noise level (70 dBA) occurs at the west façade, which is nearest and most exposed the nearby roadways. The noise levels predicted due to roadway traffic exceed the criteria listed in Section 4.2 for building components. Upgraded building components, including STC rated glazing elements and exterior walls, will be required along the building's north, east and west façades, where noise levels exceed 65 dBA.

Results of the calculations also indicate that the development will require air conditioning, which will allow occupants to keep windows closed and maintain a comfortable living environment. In addition to ventilation requirements, Warning Clauses will also be required be placed on all Lease, Purchase and Sale Agreements. The results also indicate that outdoor living areas having direct exposure to the noise sources



that are within approximately 30 metres of Scott Street and Churchill Avenue North may require noise control measures. These measures are described in Section 5.2, with the aim to reduce the L_{eq} at the OLA to as close to 55 dBA as technically, economically and administratively feasible.

A detailed roadway traffic noise study will be required at the time of site plan approval to determine specific noise control measures for the development.

Estimated vibration levels at the foundation nearest to the LRT on Scott Street are expected to be 0.019 mm/s RMS (58 dBV), based on the FTA protocol and an offset distance of 40 m to the nearest track centerline. Details of the calculation are provided in Appendix B. Since predicted vibration levels do not exceed the criterion of 0.10 mm/s RMS at the foundation, concerns due to vibration impacts on the site are not expected. As vibration levels are acceptable, correspondingly, regenerated noise levels are also expected to be acceptable.

With regards to stationary noise impacts, a stationary noise study will be performed once mechanical plans for the proposed building become available. This study would assess impacts of stationary noise from rooftop mechanical units serving the proposed building on surrounding noise-sensitive areas. This study will include recommendations for any noise control measures that may be necessary to ensure noise levels fall below ENCG and NPC-300 limits. Noise impacts can generally be minimized by judicious selection and placement of the equipment. Where necessary noise screens and silencers can be placed into the design.



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1. INTRODUCTION

Gradient Wind Engineering Inc. (Gradient Wind) was retained by Stantec on behalf of Azure Urban Developments Inc. to undertake a transportation noise and vibration feasibility assessment in support of a Zoning By-Law Amendment (ZBA) for a proposed mixed-use development at 2070 Scott Street in Ottawa, Ontario. This report summarizes the methodology, results, and recommendations related to the assessment of exterior and interior noise levels generated by local roadway and light rail traffic.

Our work is based on theoretical noise calculation methods conforming to the City of Ottawa¹ and Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP)² guidelines. Noise calculations were based on architectural drawings prepared by Quadrangle Architects Limited in August 2019, with future vehicle and light rail traffic volumes corresponding to the City of Ottawa's Official Plan (OP) roadway classifications.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

The focus of this transportation and vibration noise feasibility assessment is a proposed mixed-use development at 2070 Scott Street in Ottawa, Ontario. The study site is located on a nearly rectangular parcel of land at the intersection of Scott Street and Churchill Avenue North.

The proposed development is a 23-storey building with a stepped 5-storey podium. The building planform at grade is nearly rectangular with rectangular insets and a curved extension at the southeast corner of the site. Ground floor comprises retail use in the west side of the building, townhouse units along the east perimeter, a residential lobby and a lounge/co-work room centrally located at the north side, and building support function rooms in the remaining space. An outdoor seating area is located adjacent to the retail use at the northwest corner of the site. A loading area and covered ramp to three levels of underground parking are located at the southeast corner of the site, accessed from Winona Avenue. Residential use occupies the floors above. At Level 2, the floorplate sets back at the southeast corner to create a green roof over the covered parking ramp, and private terraces. At Level 6, the floorplate sets back from all sides to create a neatly rectangular building planform, an outdoor amenity area at the southwest corner, and

private terraces over the remaining rooftop. At the mechanical penthouse level, the floorplate sets back from the east, west and north sides to create an outdoor amenity area, adjacent to a party room at the west side of the floor.

The site is bound by Churchill Avenue North to the west, Scott Street to the north, Winona Avenue to the east and low-rise and medium-rise residential and commercial buildings to the south. Beyond Churchill Avenue North and Winona Avenue lie low-rise and medium-rise residential and commercial buildings. Beyond Scott street lies the OC Transpo Transitway. The transitway is scheduled to become a Light Rail Transit (LRT) corridor as part of Stage 2 of OC Transpo's Confederation Line.

The primary sources of transportation noise are Scott Street, Churchill Avenue North and the Light Rail Transit (LRT) corridor operated by the OC Transpo. The report also provides an analysis of ground borne vibration impacts from light rail traffic from the transit corridor toward the north. Figure 1 illustrates a complete site plan with surrounding context.

3. OBJECTIVES

The principal objectives of this study are to (i) calculate the future noise levels on the study buildings produced by local transportation traffic, (ii) predict vibration levels on the study building produced from passing light rail trains, (iii) ensure that interior and exterior noise levels do not exceed the allowable limits specified by the City of Ottawa's Environmental Noise Control Guidelines as outlined in Section 4.2 of this report, and (iv) ensure vibration levels do not exceed the allowable limits specified by the FTA.

4. METHODOLOGY

4.1 Background

Noise can be defined as any obtrusive sound. It is created at a source, transmitted through a medium, such as air, and intercepted by a receiver. Noise may be characterized in terms of the power of the source or the sound pressure at a specific distance. While the power of a source is characteristic of that particular source, the sound pressure depends on the location of the receiver and the path that the noise takes to reach the receiver. Measurement of noise is based on the decibel unit, dBA, which is a logarithmic ratio referenced to a standard noise level (2×10^{-5} Pascals). The 'A' suffix refers to a weighting scale, which better represents how the noise is perceived by the human ear. With this scale, a doubling of power results in a



3 dBA increase in measured noise levels and is just perceptible to most people. An increase of 10 dBA is often perceived to be twice as loud.

4.2 Transportation Traffic Noise

4.2.1 Criteria for Transportation Traffic Noise

For surface transportation traffic noise, the equivalent sound energy level, L_{eq} , provides a measure of the time varying noise levels, which is well correlated with the annoyance of sound. It is defined as the continuous sound level, which has the same energy as a time varying noise level over a period of time. For roadways, the L_{eq} is commonly calculated on the basis of a 16-hour (L_{eq16}) daytime (07:00-23:00) / 8-hour (L_{eq8}) nighttime (23:00-07:00) split to assess its impact on residential buildings. The City of Ottawa's Environmental Noise Control Guidelines (ENCG) specifies that the recommended indoor noise limit range (that is relevant to this study) is 50, 45 and 40 dBA for retail, living rooms, and sleeping quarters respectively as listed in Table 1. However, to account for deficiencies in building construction and control peak noise, these levels should be targeted toward 47, 42 and 37 dBA respectively.

Predicted noise levels at the plane of window (POW) dictate the action required to achieve the recommended sound levels. An open window is considered to provide a 10 dBA reduction in noise, while

a standard closed window is capable of providing a minimum 20 dBA noise reduction⁴. A closed window due to a ventilation requirement will bring noise levels down to achieve an acceptable indoor environment⁵. Therefore, where noise levels exceed 55 dBA daytime and 50 dBA nighttime, the ventilation for the building should consider the need for having windows and doors closed, which triggers the need for forced air heating with provision for central air conditioning. Where noise levels exceed 65 dBA daytime and 60 dBA nighttime, air conditioning will be required and building components will require higher levels of sound attenuation⁶.

The sound level criterion for outdoor living areas is 55 dBA, which applies during the daytime (07:00 to 23:00). When noise levels exceed 55 dBA, mitigation must be provided to reduce noise levels where technically and administratively feasible to acceptable levels at or below the criterion.

4.2.2 Theoretical Roadway Noise Predictions

Noise predictions were performed with the aid of the MECP computerized noise assessment program, STAMSON 5.04, for road analysis. Appendix A includes the STAMSON 5.04 input and output data.

Transportation traffic noise calculations were performed by treating each roadway segment as separate line sources of noise. In addition to the traffic volumes summarized in Table 2, theoretical noise predictions were based on the following parameters:

- Truck traffic on all roadways was taken to comprise 5% heavy trucks and 7% medium trucks, as per ENCG requirements for noise level predictions.
- The day/night split for all streets was taken to be 92%/8%, respectively.
- Ground surfaces were taken to be reflective due to the presence of hard (paved) ground.
- Topography was assumed to be a flat/gentle slope surrounding the study building. Ground
 elevation was taken to be 65.6m closest to the retail stores (northwest side), and 63.1m closest
 to the townhouses (northeast side).
- Receptor heights (outlined in Table 3) represent the centre of the plane of window along the building façades, in addition to the outdoor living areas along the perimeter of the building.

- For select sources where appropriate, the proposed building was used as a barrier with a height
 of 17 metres, partially or fully obstructing exposure to the source as illustrated by exposure angles
 in Figures 3-8.
- Nearby buildings surrounding the site were considered as noise barriers partially or fully obstructing exposure to the source as illustrated by exposure angles in Figures 3-8.
- Noise receptors were strategically placed at 13 locations around the study area (see Figure 2).
- A difference in elevation for the Light Rail Transit (LRT) line was measured to be 6 meters below grade.
- Receptor distances and exposure angles are illustrated in Figures 3-8.
- LRT noise assessed in STAMSON using RT Custom based on 4 car SRT.

4.2.1 Roadway Traffic Volumes

The ENCG dictates that noise calculations should consider future sound levels based on a roadway's classification at the mature state of development. Therefore, traffic volumes are based on the roadway classifications outlined in the City of Ottawa's Official Plan (OP) and Transportation Master Plan⁷ which provide additional details on future roadway expansions. Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volumes are then based on data in Table B1 of the ENCG for each roadway classification. Table 2 (below) summarizes the AADT values used for each roadway included in this assessment.

4.3 Ground Vibration and Ground-borne Noise

Rail systems and heavy vehicles on roadways can produce perceptible levels of ground vibrations, especially when they are in close proximity to residential neighbourhoods or vibration-sensitive buildings. Similar to sound waves in air, vibrations in solids are generated at a source, propagated through a medium, and intercepted by a receiver. In the case of ground vibrations, the medium can be uniform, or more often, a complex layering of soils and rock strata. Also, similar to sound waves in air, ground vibrations produce perceptible motions and regenerated noise known as 'ground-borne noise' when the vibrations encounter a hollow structure such as a building. Ground-borne noise and vibrations are generated when there is excitation of the ground, such as from a train. Repetitive motion of the wheels on the track or rubber tires passing over an uneven surface causes vibrations to propagate through the soil. When they encounter a building, vibrations pass along the structure of the building beginning at the foundation and propagating to all floors. Air inside the building excited by the vibrating walls and floors represents regenerated airborne noise. Characteristics of the soil and the building are imparted to the noise, thereby creating a unique noise signature.

Human response to ground vibrations is dependent on the magnitude of the vibrations, which is measured by the root mean square (RMS) of the movement of a particle on a surface. Typical units of ground vibration measures are millimeters per second (mm/s), or inch per second (in/s). Since vibrations can vary over a wide range, it is also convenient to represent them in decibel units, or dBV. In North America, it is common practice to use the reference value of one micro-inch per second (μin/s) to represent vibration levels for this purpose. The threshold level of human perception to vibrations is about 0.10 mm/s RMS or about 72 dBV. Although somewhat variable, the threshold of annoyance for continuous vibrations is 0.5 mm/s RMS (or 85 dBV), five times higher than the perception threshold, whereas the threshold for significant structural damage is 10 mm/s RMS (or 112 dBV), at least one hundred times higher than the perception threshold level.

4.3.1 Ground Vibration Criteria

In the United States, the Federal Transportation Authority (FTA) has set vibration criteria for sensitive land uses next to transit corridors. Similar standards have been developed by the MECP. These standards indicate that the appropriate criteria for residences is 0.10 mm/s RMS for vibrations. For main line



railways, a document titled *Guidelines for New Development in Proximity to Railway Operations*⁸, indicates that vibration conditions should not exceed 0.14 mm/s RMS averaged over a one second time-period at the first floor and above of the proposed building. The Federal Transportation Authority (FTA) criterion was adopted as the appropriate standard for this study. As the main vibration source is due to the light rail line which has frequent events, the 0.10 mm/s RMS (72 dBV) vibration criteria and 35 dBA ground borne noise criteria were adopted for this study.

4.3.2 Theoretical Ground Vibration Prediction Procedure

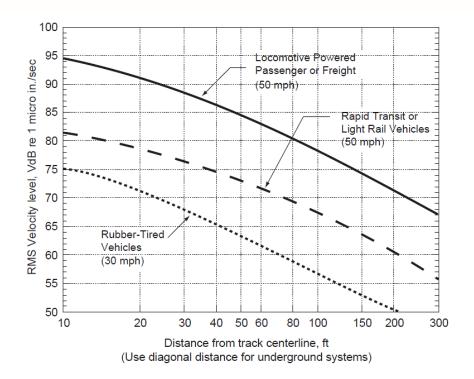
Potential vibration impacts of the trains were predicted using the Federal Transit Authority's (FTA) *Transit Noise and Vibration Impact Assessment*⁹ protocol. The FTA general vibration assessment is based on an upper bound generic set of curves that show vibration level attenuation with distance. These curves, illustrated in the figure on the following page, are based on ground vibration measurements at various transit systems throughout North America. Vibration levels at points of reception are adjusted by various factors to incorporate known characteristics of the system being analyzed, such as operating speed of vehicle, conditions of the track, construction of the track and geology, as well as the structural type of the impacted building structures. The vibration impact on the building was determined using a set of curves for LRT at a speed of 50 mph. Adjustment factors were considered based on the following information:

- The maximum operating speed of the light rail assumed to be 43 mph (70 km/h) at peak
- The offset distance between the development and the closest track is 40 m
- The vehicles are assumed to have soft primary suspensions
- Tracks are not welded, though in otherwise good condition
- Soil conditions do not efficiently propagate vibrations
- The building's foundation coupling is large masonry on piles

5. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

5.1 Roadway Traffic Noise Levels

The results of the roadway traffic noise calculations are summarized in Table 3 below. A complete set of input and output data from all STAMSON 5.04 calculations are available in Appendix A.

The results of the current analysis indicate that noise levels will range between 56 and 70 dBA during the daytime period (07:00-23:00) and between 58 and 62 dBA during the nighttime period (23:00-07:00). The highest noise level (70 dBA) occurs at the west façade, which is nearest and most exposed the nearby roadways. Upgraded building components and air conditioning will be required. Detailed mitigation measures would be subject of a detailed noise assessment during the site plan approval stage.

Results also indicate that outdoor living areas having direct exposure to the noise sources that are within approximately 30 metres of Scott Street and Churchill Avenue North may require noise control measures such as perimeter noise barriers / guards where technically, economically and administratively feasible.



5.2 Ground Vibrations and Ground-Borne Noise Levels

Estimated vibration levels at the foundation nearest to the LRT on Scott Street are expected to be 0.019 mm/s RMS (58 dBV), based on the FTA protocol and an offset distance of 40 m to the nearest track centerline. Details of the calculation are provided in Appendix B. Noise impacts from the building itself on sensitive areas around the building are expected to be minimal

and a detailed acoustic report will address any potential concerns. This report will be competed once the

mechanical information for the building is known. Typically, noise levels can be controlled by judicious

selection and placement of the equipment and the introduction of silencers or noise screens where

needed.
